<a href="#">Edcheckup</a>	Edcheckup™ offers a <b>progress monitoring system</b> for students in grades K-8 that evaluates student performance and measures student progress toward goals in reading, writing, and math. These generic assessments, which are independent from any particular curriculum, may also be used to evaluate the effectiveness of instruction through the graphing of student data.
