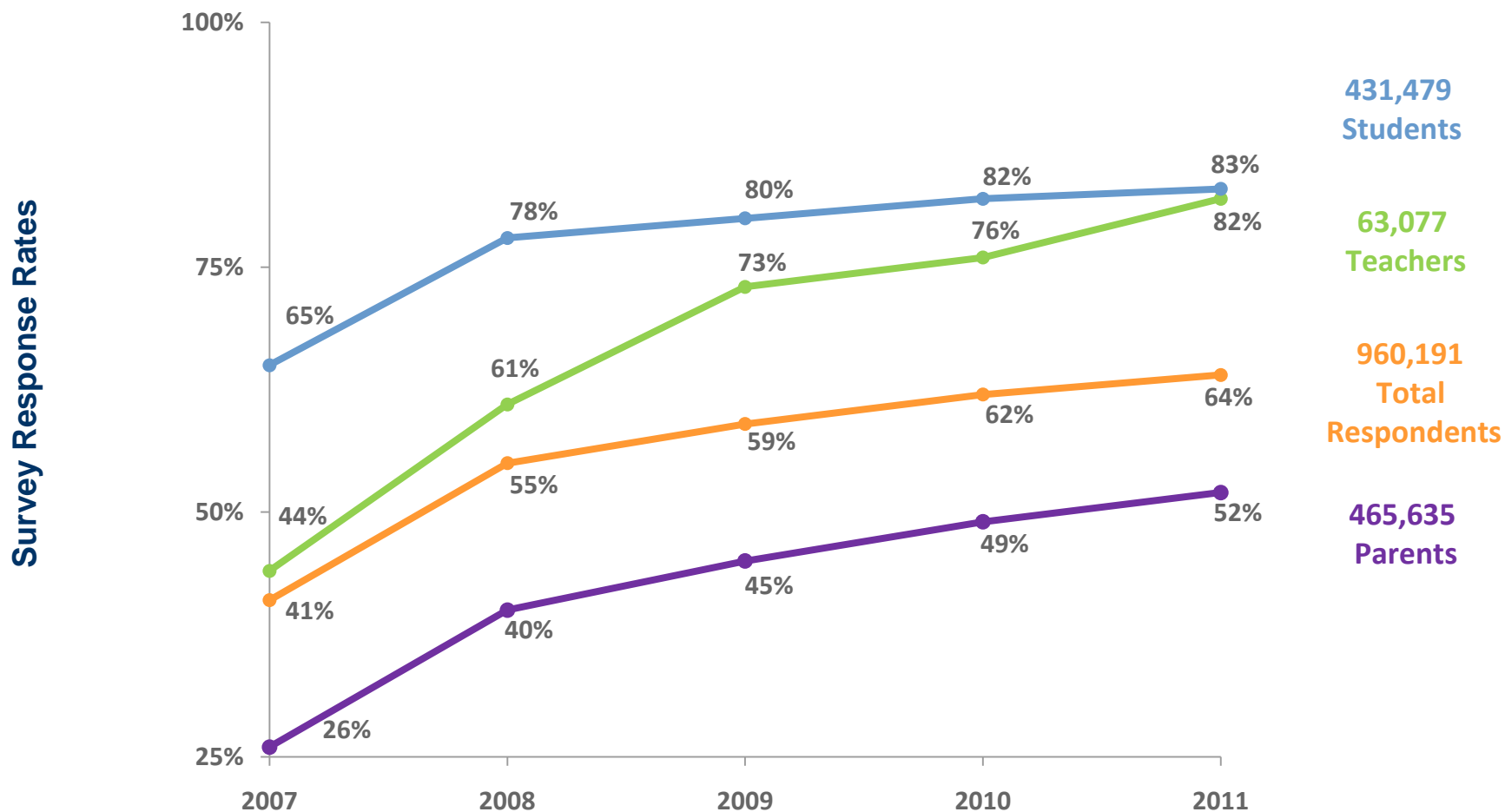


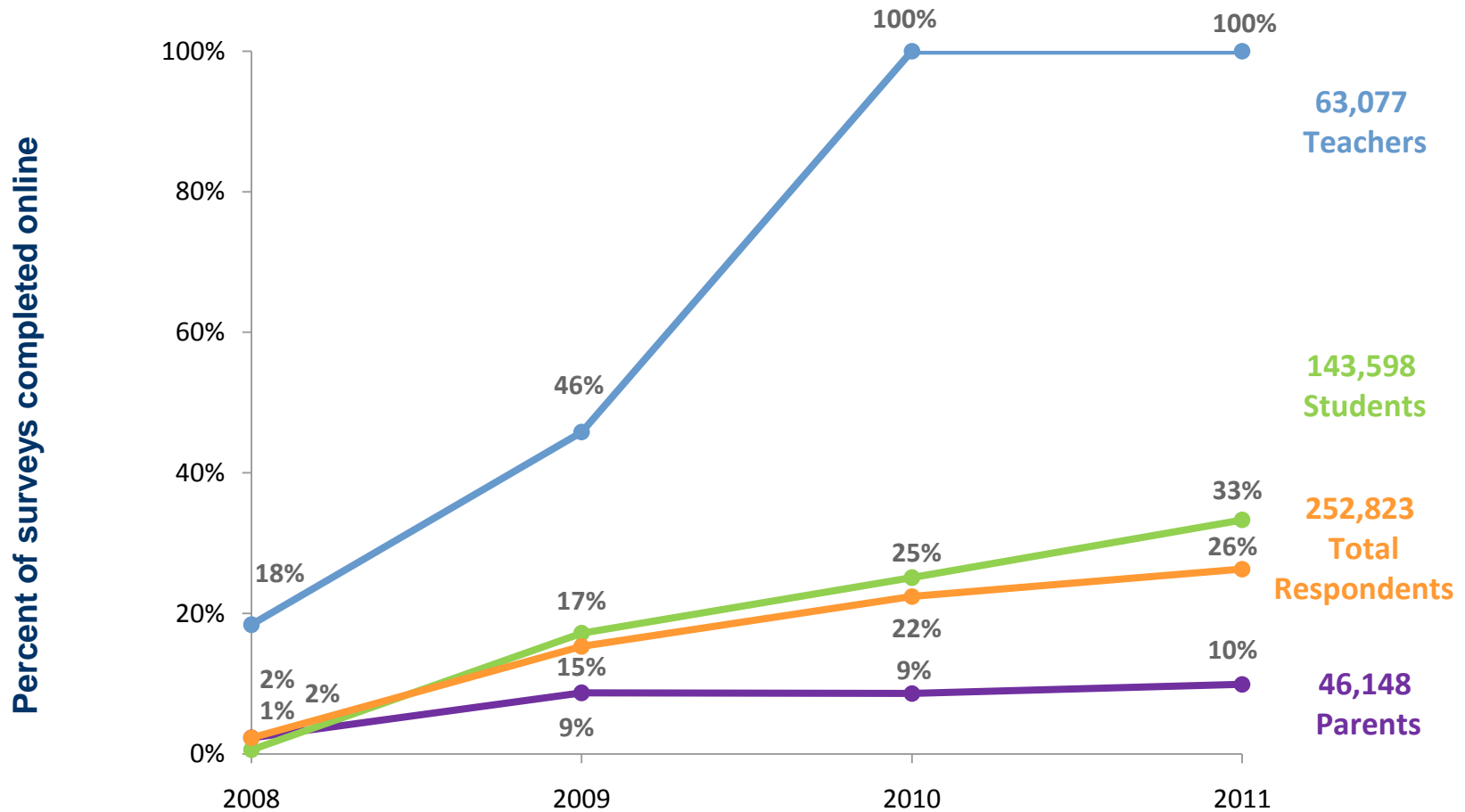

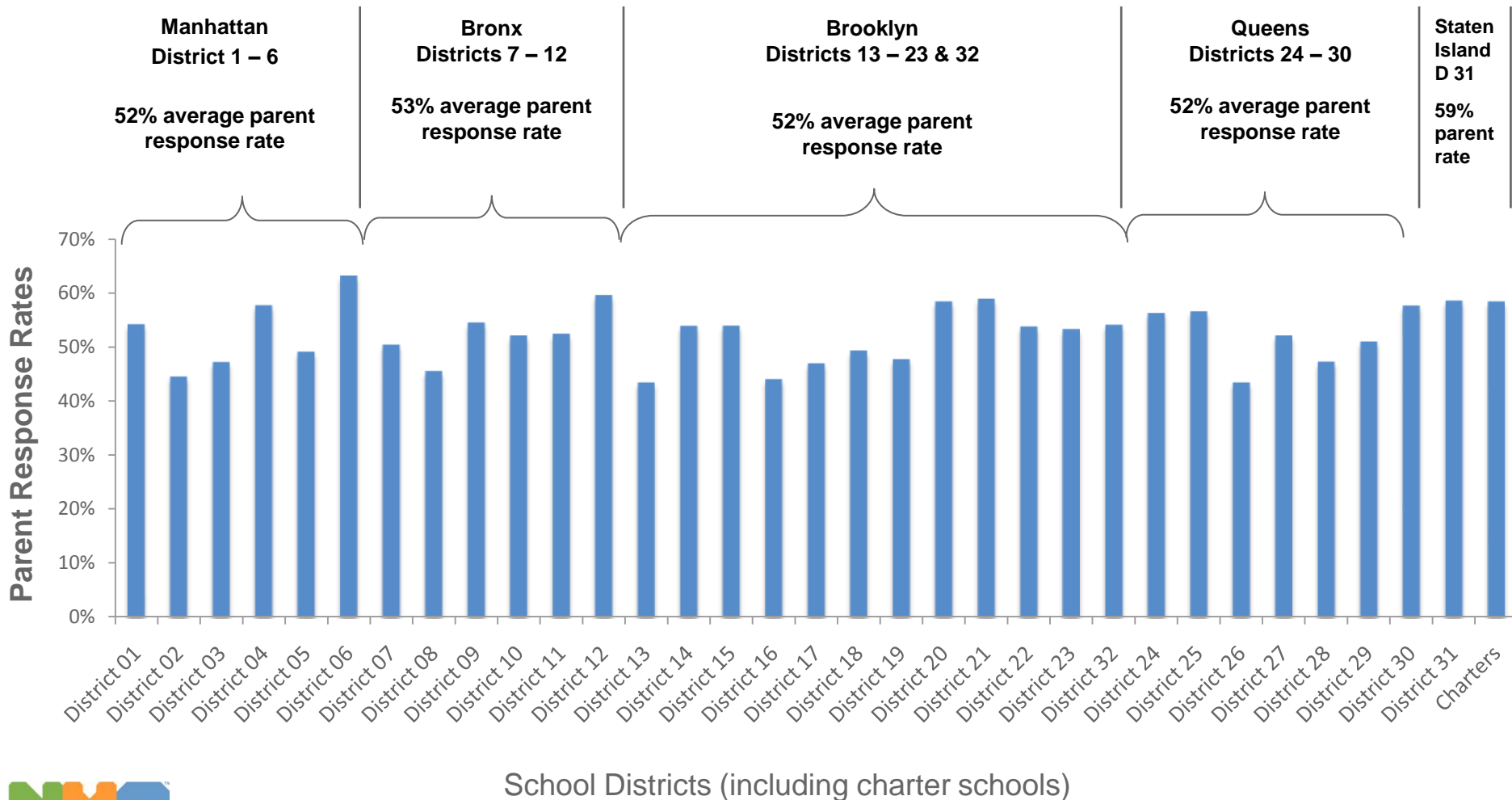
Parents, students, and teachers reached new all-time participation highs



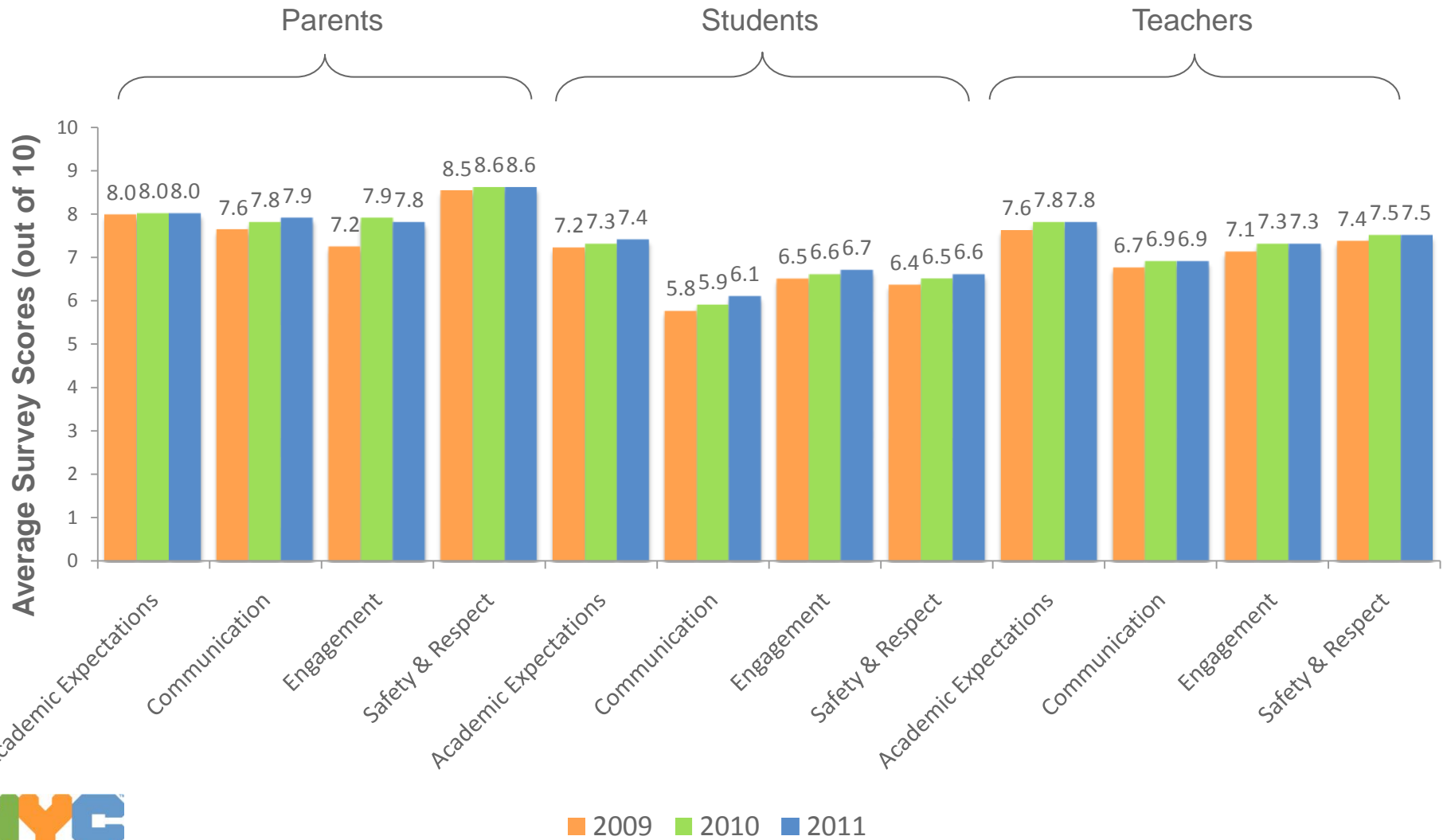
Schools reached new all-time highs in online participation, 1 in 4 surveys were taken online



A majority of parents participated across all boroughs

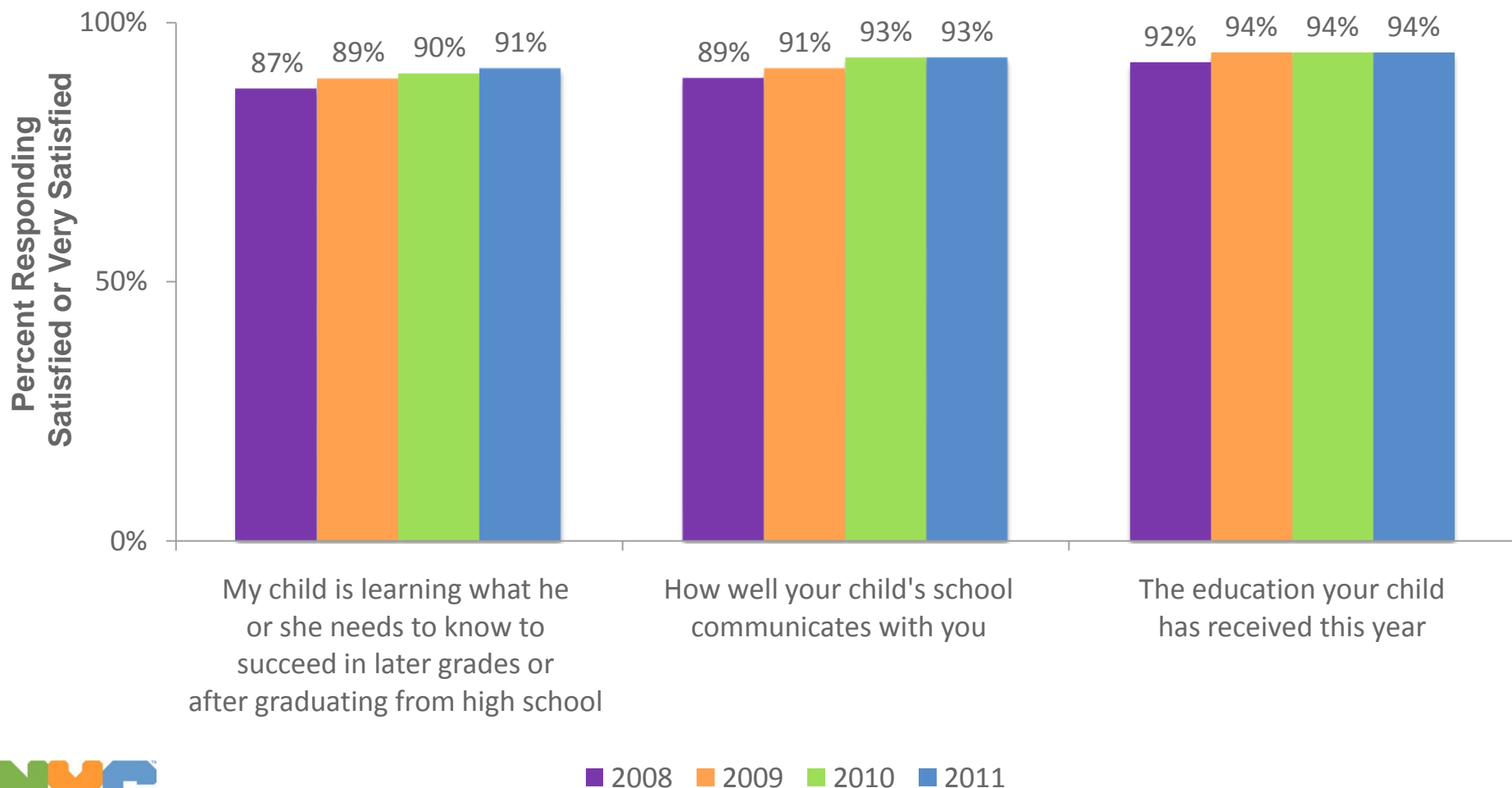


Parent, student, and teacher satisfaction remained high across domains

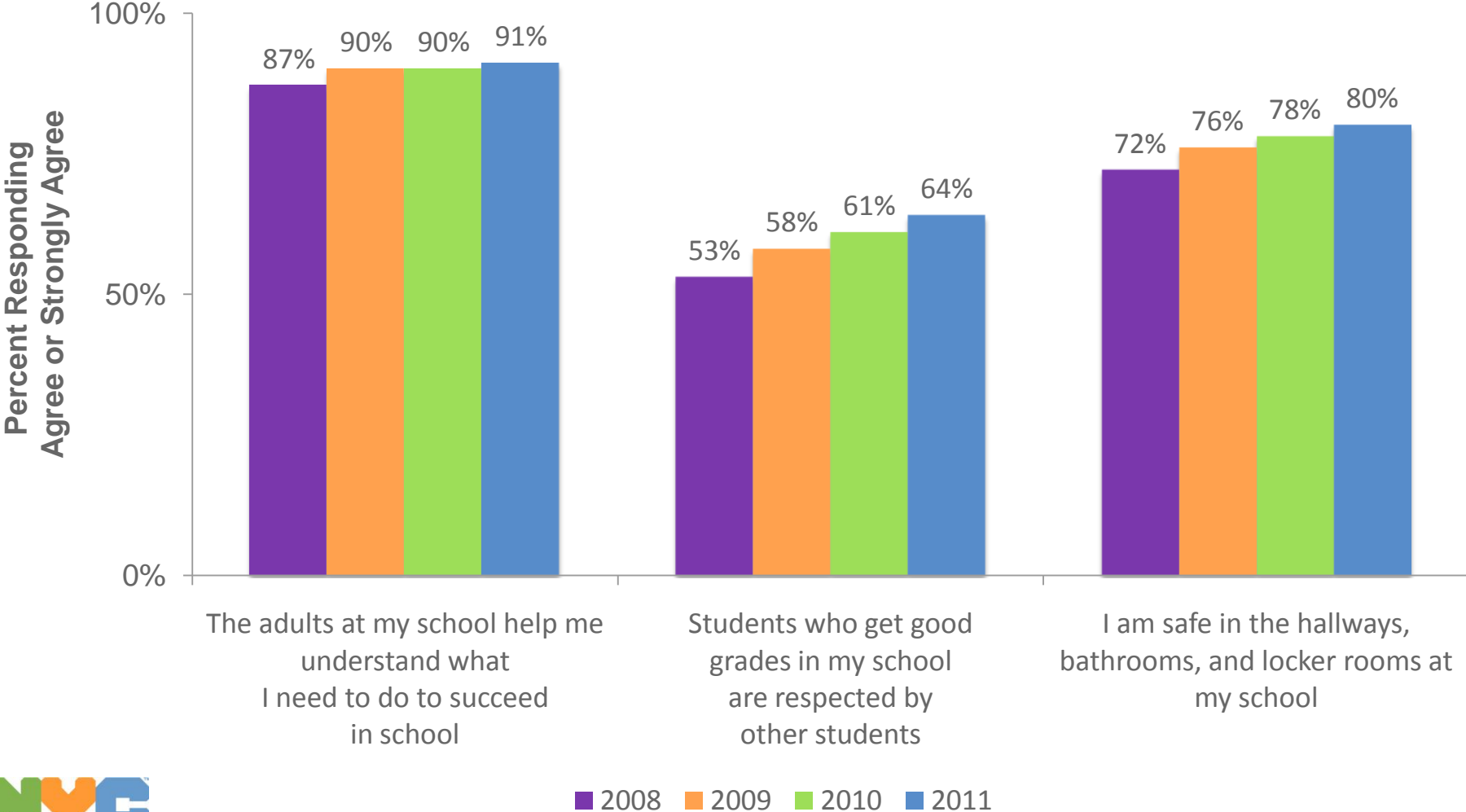

Parents indicated high levels of satisfaction with schools

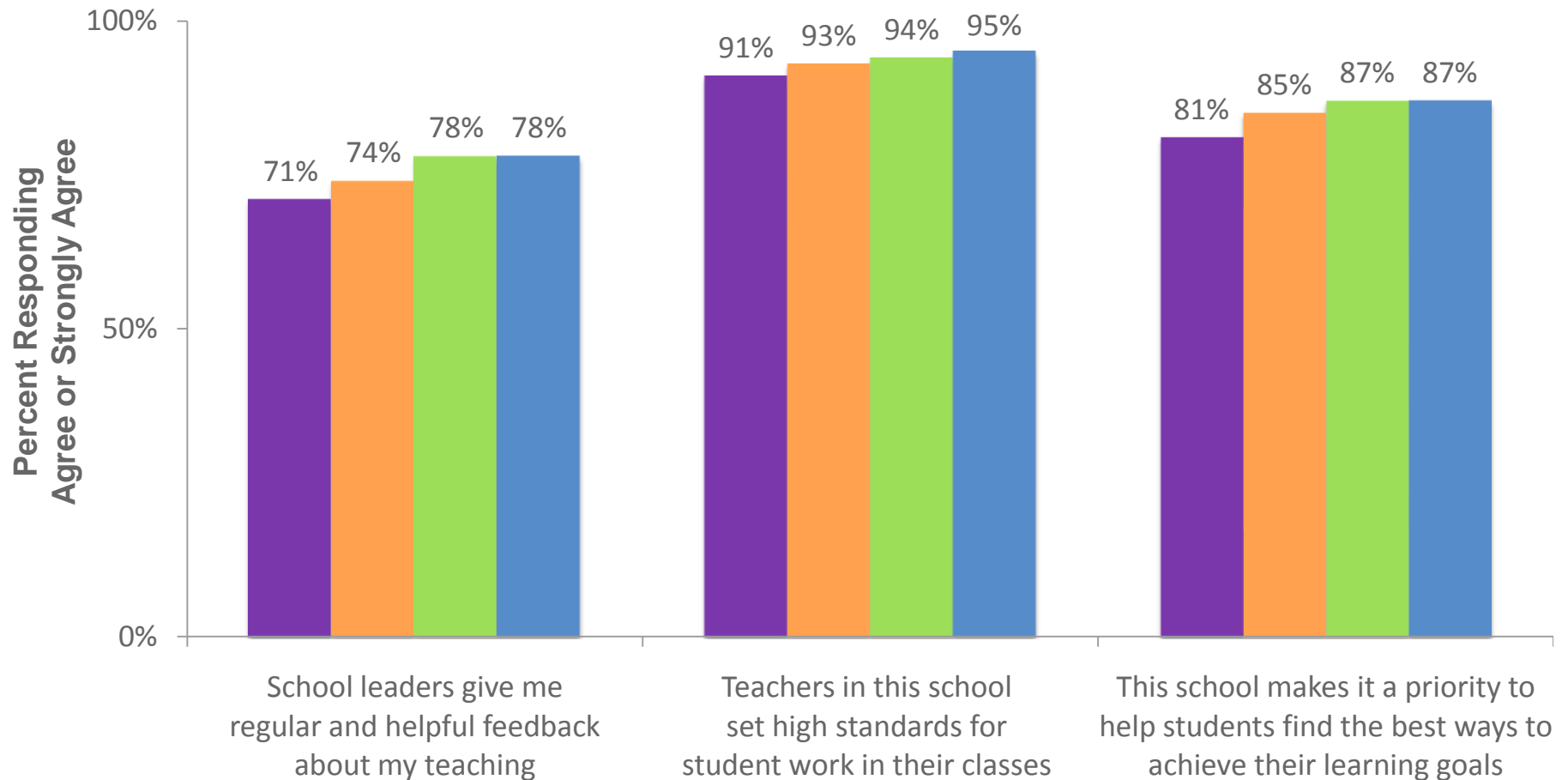


Students demonstrated increased satisfaction in key areas



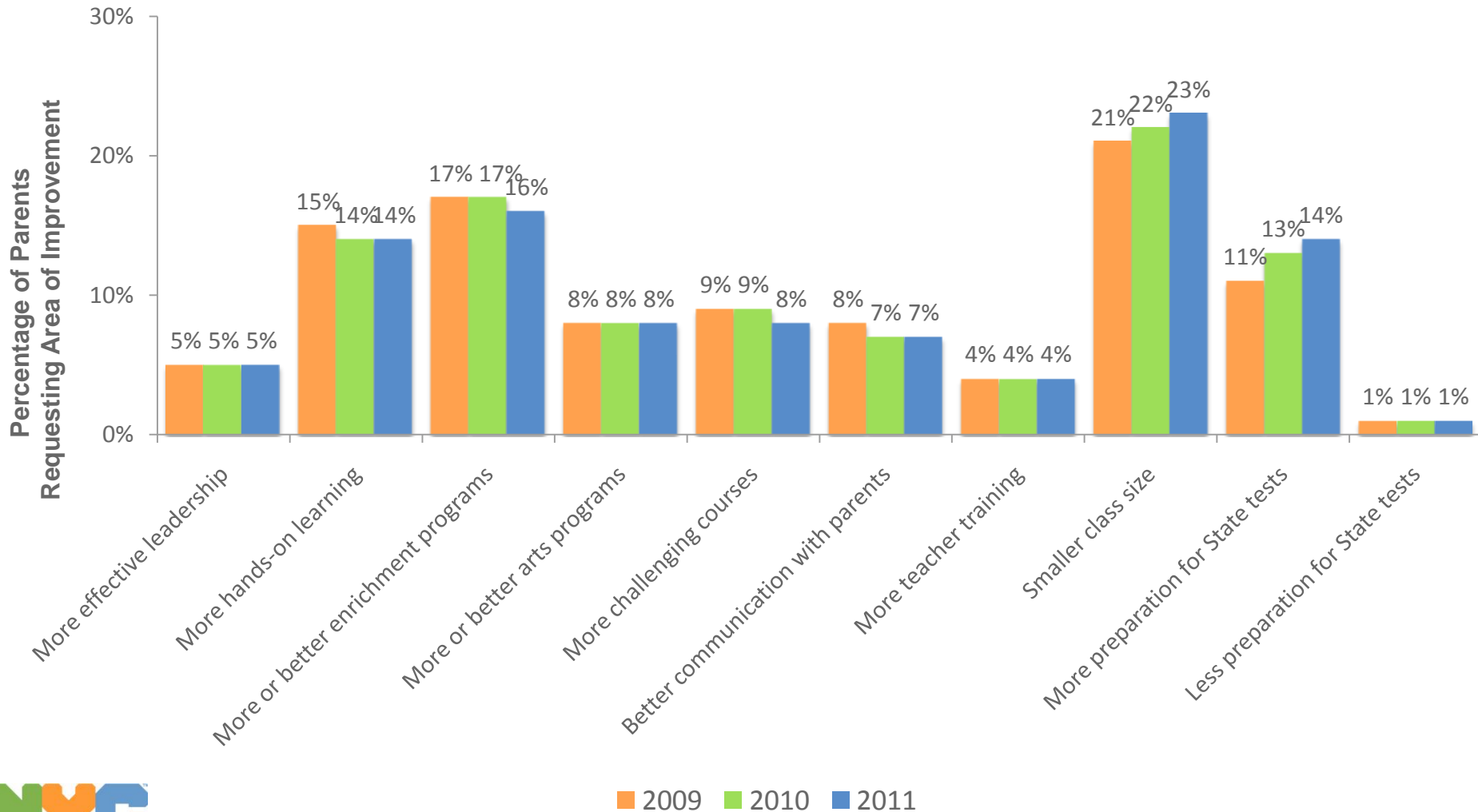

Parent requests for school improvements remained consistent



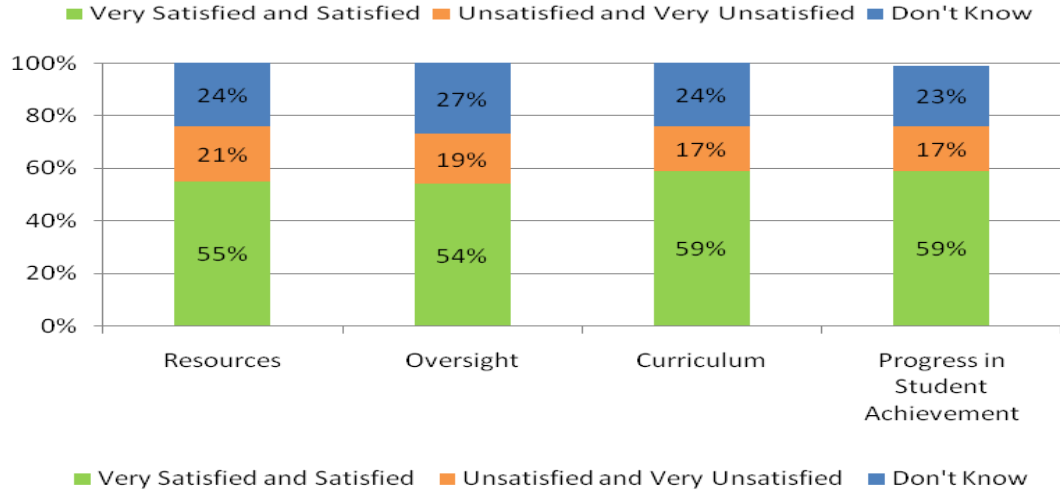
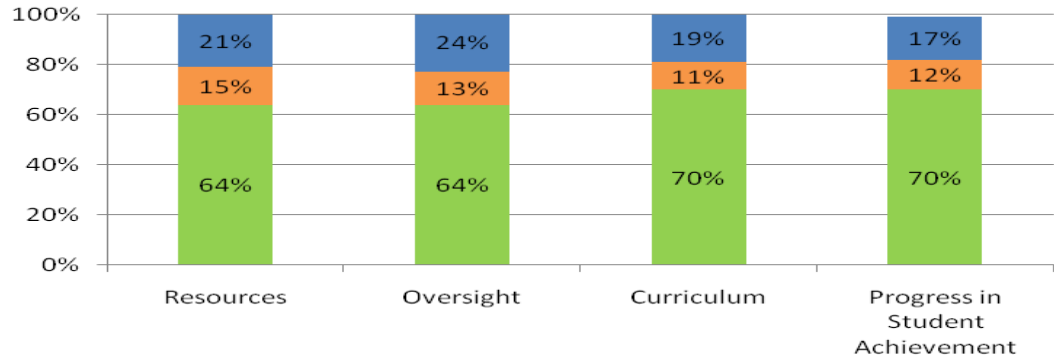

Parent satisfaction with the performance of the citywide **Panel for Educational Policy** with regard to school:

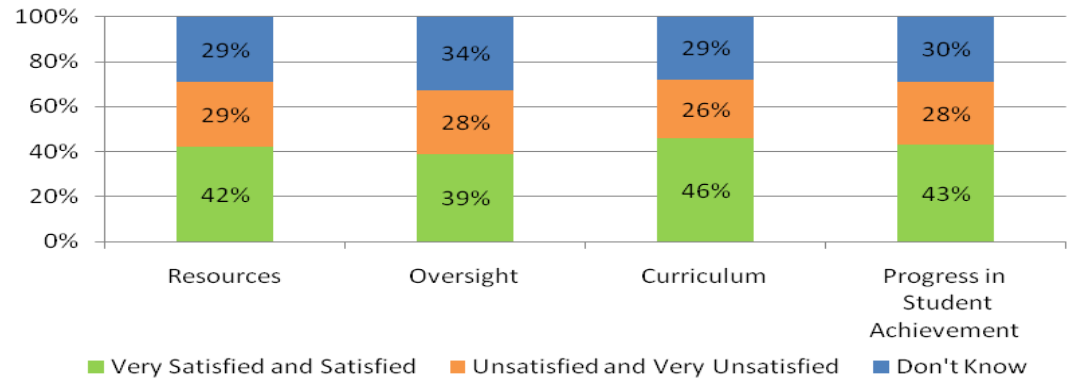

Parent satisfaction with the performance of the **Schools Chancellor** with regard to school:



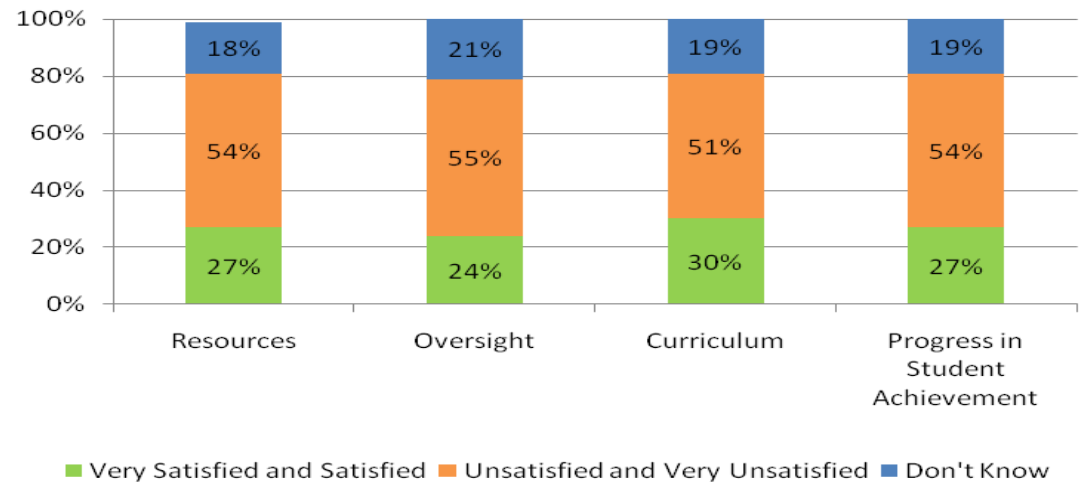
Teacher satisfaction with the Panel for Educational Policy and Schools Chancellor

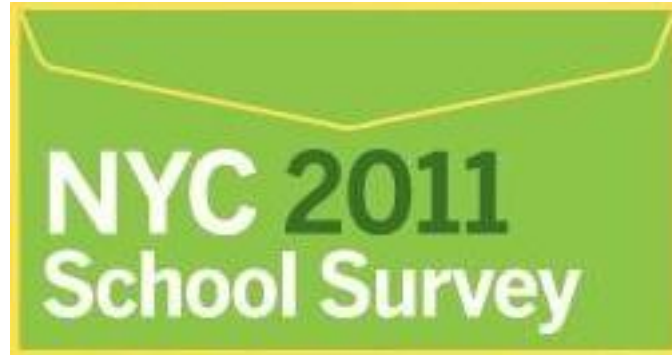
Teacher satisfaction with the performance of the **Panel for Educational Policy** with regard to school:
